Campion's Geography Class Presents Bi-Annual Exhibition

We're proud of our geography students who presented their projects on Sunday, November 20, during the class exhibition. Each group created a map and travel brochure, scale model, video, and 4-course meal.

Judges enjoyed delicious food (3 4-course meals!) and were able to see tourism highlights, social issues, and Adventist presence, among other things, in each of the videos. Many of the scale models included elements created on Campion's 3D printer or the woodshop's CNC engraving machine. The project requires collaboration,

innovative thinking, and use of technology—all skills we encourage in our academy students.

CNC Machining is a process used in the manufacturing sector that involves the use of computers to control machine tools. Tools that can be controlled in this manner include lathes, mills, routers and grinders. The CNC in CNC Machining stands for Computer Numerical Control.
